aliyah is a 47-year old woman who immigrated from malaysia to attend college in america. cooking homemade malaysian food is important to her and reminds her of breakfasts and dinners with her mother and father, who still live in malaysia.

she owns a house with a large backyard and often finds seeds for asian vegetables at her local asian grocery market. she has been gardening for over 30 years, but wonders if she could be more efficient with spacing and planting.

aliyah is looking for an app that:

- has information regarding the asian vegetables she already grows, such as japanese eggplants, bok choy, thai basil, okra, and bitter melons
- has information regarding new asian vegetables beyond the ones she is currently growing
- offers advice on efficient gardening (such as use of space)





meet josie.

josie is a 26-year old chinese american woman who recently graduated from college. she has just moved into a new townhouse with space to garden in her backyard. she has been trying to get in touch with her chinese roots and is starting by learning to cook with chinese vegetables.

however, josie lives in a predominantly white neighborhood with very few asian grocery stores in the surrounding area. she has been unable to find a store that sells the vegetables at a reasonable price, and has had even less luck finding a store that sells asian plant seeds.

josie is looking for an app that:

- has information regarding where to find asian plant seeds, both online and local
- is beginner-friendly and aids in the gardening process from start to finish (seeding to harvesting)
- provides a community to ask questions

Josie no longer struggles to find vegetables for her Chinese cuisine, and has started learning how to cook other types of Asian cuisine with her new vegetables.

Josie invites some of her friends over for a "harvest party" - she grew more vegetables than she could eat, so she decided to share them with people she knew. When they ask how she learned to garden, she introduces them to *flourish*.

> > Josie's friend, Mia, recommends that she download the app, *flourish*, as it helped her with growing "exotic" plants


